


Villmarkspregede områder i Norge

- ➤ The Norwegian Grandparents' Climate Campaign, GCC, was formed in 2006 by a group of concerned elders
- ➤ Initiated by Halfdan Wiik, librarian and environmental activist
- ➤ Independent organization from 2012
- ➤ 6800 members paid membership
- > 17 local branches
- > Supported by the state
- > Part of a European network
- Known for its activism, knowledge-based policy recommendations, unpretentiousness and use of culture and humour



Our purpose

We aim at comprehensive cuts in greenhouse gas emissions. We also want to preserve nature and biodiversity. Further consumption growth must be curtailed, and we must move towards a more circular, and less wastefull economy.

We therefore demand that Article 112 of the Norwegian Constitution be taken seriously:

"Everyone has the right to an environment that ensures health, and to a nature in which productive capacity and diversity are preserved. Natural resources shall be used on the basis of a long-term and comprehensive consideration that safeguards this right also for posterity".
